HISTORY

Prior to the construction of the dam in 1975, Scoggins Valley was filled with vast farms and country roads. Before settlers arrived, the valley was the seasonal home of the Tualatin Band of Atfalati-Kalapuya tribe. While traversing the trail, glimpses of history can still be seen. Whether you are passing through orchards of fruit trees, riding on abandoned roadbeds, catching glimpses of the remains of former structures or taking in the country side.









HIKE, BIKE & RUN

Scoggins Valley Park features an easy to moderate 13.6-mile trail that encircles Henry Hagg Lake. From the trail you have beautiful views of the water and surrounding foothills as you meander through open meadows and wooded lands. Access is provided from many trailheads, allowing for shorter trips or a completion of the entire 13.6-mile loop (11.6 miles on dirt/gravel and 2 miles on pavement). The loop features paved sections at Eagle Point Recreation Area (480') and Sain Creek Recreation Area (934').

TRAIL ETIQUETTE

- Stay on the trail to protect nearby habitat.
- · Bikers yield to hikers/runners.
- E-bikes are prohibited on the trail.
- Leash and clean up after pets.
- Pack it in. Pack it out.

PARK INFORMATION

Parking passes are available at the Fee Booth, Park Office, C-Ramp Recreation Area and nearby at Lake Stop Grocery. Pass must be displayed properly in vehicle. 911 calls are free from Emergency Telephones. Cell service is generally limited to AT&T. There is reliable GPS coverage.

DIRECTIONS

From Portland, travel west to Forest Grove.

At the intersection of Hwy 47 and Pacific Avenue travel south for 5 miles. At Scoggins Valley Road turn west and travel 3 miles.

From McMinnville, travel north on Hwy 47 for 21 miles. At Scoggins Valley Road turn west and travel 3 miles.

HOURS

Scoggins Valley Park (home of Henry Hagg Lake) is open sunrise to sunset, seven days a week, year-round.


